How to organize your dialogue circle:

- 1. Remember that it's YOU your connections, your enthusiasm and your passion that will get people in the door so don't hold back!
- 2. Set your date, time, and place. We are asking that all parties be hosted before June 1.
- 3. Make a short list of "connectors" in your community; those natural organizers/leaders who are great at motivating others and could help you spread the word. Reach out to them personally and talk about what this event means to you. Ask them to help you make this a success.
- 4. Think about the maximum number of people you would feel comfortable hosting in a discussion, and then double that number for your invitation list.
- 5. Send an initial invitation via email to your list. You can find text to borrow from below.
- 6. Send 2-3 reminders to sign up for your event. Many people come to events after being reminded 2, 3 or even 4 times. So keep in mind: you are doing people a service and they most likely do want to come!
- 7. You can do this all more informally by email and phone, but if you want to plug into your organization's existing event systems, by all means do so! If you want to get more professional about it, you can also use a service like evite or paperless post.
